








Carissa Szabo

Major: Education

The combination of a strong education program with robust study abroad opportunities was the magnet that drew Carissa Szabo '24 to Endicott. "The education program here is incredible," she said. "I feel very prepared to be a teacher. The professors do a great job of making sure you get lots of field experience." Szabo continued, "And I always knew I wanted to study abroad. It was like I had a seed planted for my love of international travel. Endicott helped that blossom."

Taylor Yates

Major: Accounting/Sport Management

Taylor Yates '24 came to Endicott because it was one of the few schools that could accommodate his dream of a double major. "Sports is a really hard industry to get into. I thought having an accounting degree in addition to my sport management degree would help me stand out."

In addition to playing both baseball and basketball at Endicott and being one of the basketball team's managers, Yates has excelled academically while having multiple internships in sports and accounting. "It's a lot of work to do all of it, but everyone in the Athletics Department has been so supportive and given me flexibility when I needed it," he says

Percival "Percy" Sibanda

Major: Business Management

Percival "Percy" Sibanda '24 came to the U.S. at the age of 14 from his home country of Zimbabwe, a nation that has long been embroiled in a human rights crisis, to attend Brooks School in North Andover, Mass. Homesick at first, the outgoing and personable student soon found his place within the community. When it came time to choose a college, Sibanda chose Endicott because of its distinct internship program and the opportunity to continue his soccer career for the Gulls.

Now a senior at Endicott, the business management major is pursuing a career as a CPA, and has continued to build community, both as a midfielder for the men's soccer program and through his volunteerism on campus. During the last four years, he has felt embraced in return. "The support I've received from everyone at Endicott has made me feel like a part of this community," Sibanda said. "I'm proud to say this is my home away from home."

"The Endicott [experience] has made me more ambitious," said Sibanda. "I had goals but didn't know if they were achievable. When it came time to apply for colleges, I decided that Endicott was the only school I wanted to go to, so I only applied here. If I was to redo it all, I'd do the same thing. This has been the best four years of my life."

Madison Durfee



Dina Gentile Professor of Sport Management School of Sport Science

The primary driver of the esports management degree program at Endicott, Dr. Dina Gentile is helping students tap into a new and fast-advancing industry. The author of *Introduction to Esports Management*, Gentile wrote the textbook inspired mainly by her observations of the strategies and online relationships her son was building as a gamer. Through the program, Gentile is changing the way schools adopt and embrace esports management as an academic discipline. Using existing classes in computer science, the professor is allowing esports students to get a more technical curriculum that tailors their knowledge to include game programming and design. Gentile has presented her work at the AAHPERD Convention, NASSM Conferences, COSMA Conferences, and MAHPERD Convention.

Meet Your Professors



Juan Carlos Morales Associate Professor, Graphic Design School of Visual & Performing Arts

Juan Carlos Morales teaches a variety of graphic design courses. His positivity and creative mind push students to reveal their own creativity, most recently in real-world projects for local nonprofits. Originally from Colombia, Morales has worked with numerous top-tier agencies and launched his own firm, Fabrika Studio. He describes Endicott as "different, intimate, and people-oriented." Since joining the full-time faculty in September 2021, he's pushed the envelope with avant-garde course activities, design binges, and multidisciplinary projects.



Bethany Nasser

Assistant Professor of Nursing Cummings School of Nursing & Health Sciences

After working as an instructor at Massachusetts General Hospital, Dr. Bethany Nasser knew she wanted to teach, so she went back to school to get her master's degree. She has been a nurse educator for 30 years and in 2024 was named Faculty of the Year, an honor awarded based on student votes. Nasser is a favorite faculty member because of her connection to students and the positivity she brings to every class. She is known for imparting "Nasserisms" to her students, bits of wisdom and life lessons her nursing students have come to cherish. She advises students who are ready to seek a job that their happiness and working with people they like who will mentor and help them grow is worth more than any money they could make. Above all, she encourages students to do what makes them happy.



Luke Reynolds

Associate Professor School of Education

The author of 17 books, Dr. Luke Reynolds most recently turned his pen toward the stories of 60 public figures who each turned a personal trauma into resilience. Reynolds intimately understands trauma—years ago, he survived a head-on collision and is lucky to be alive. In his latest book, *Braver Than I Thought*, Reynolds said, "I wanted to explore people I admired and look at their lives through the lens of how they learned to live with trauma, cope with it, and still be the best versions of themselves."

Ryan Blodgett

General Manager, La Chanterelle & Culinary Arts Instructor Curtis L. Gerrish School of Business

With more than 20 years of experience in the food and beverage industry, Ryan Blodgett has worked throughout the North Shore in several prominent restaurants, experiencing management-level employment in both the front and back of the house. Blodgett was able to earn degrees in culinary arts and hospitality, including his MBA from Endicott, while working full-time as a bar manager with wine menus boasting over 400 labels. He believes that when students learn the workings of a restaurant at La Chanterelle, they build transferable management skills. "That's what we tell students in that first workshop. You're learning transferable management. How to time manage yourself, your team, your surroundings, everything," said Blodgett. "It's the students' managerial classroom."

Jessica Ventura

Associate Professor, Mechanical Engineering School of Science & Technology

Dr. Jessica Ventura is a mechanical engineer specializing in the biomechanics of human movement. Educated at the University of Texas at Austin, Ventura uses personalized biomechanics analysis to inform runners and athletes of injury risk and helped create the curriculum for Endicott's undergraduate engineering program. She also helped establish the Endicott affiliate of the Society of Women Engineers organization.

Elizabeth Matelski

Associate Professor of History School of Social Sciences, Communication, & Humanities

Passionate about American multiculturalism, popular culture, and incorporating digital technology into her history teachings, Dr. Liz Matelski has most recently delved into the legacy of American slavery to uncover the truth behind the namesake of Endicott's own Mingo Beach. A recipient of the 2022 inaugural Tadler Center Fellowship, Matelski is also Co-Director of the National Endowment for the Humanities Summer Seminar "The Salem Witch Trials: Their World and Legacy," a three-week institute for middle and high school teachers. She was the recipient of the 2022 Endicott Academic Excellence Award.


