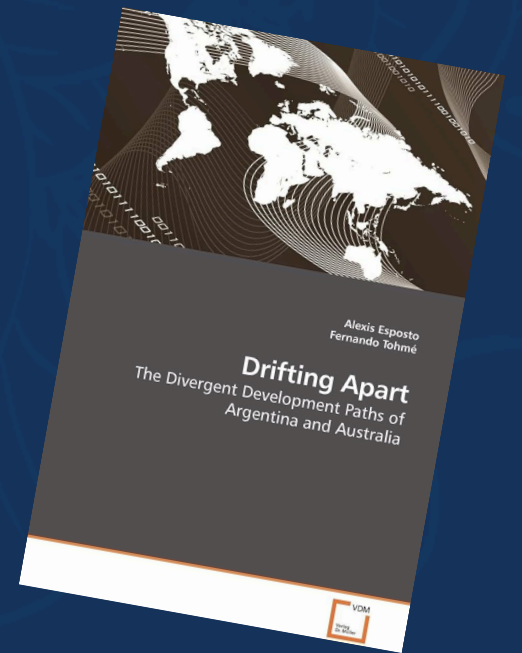
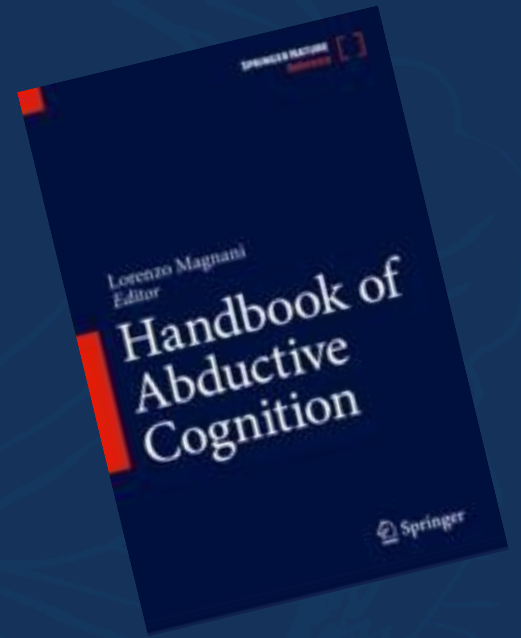
# Fernando Tohmé

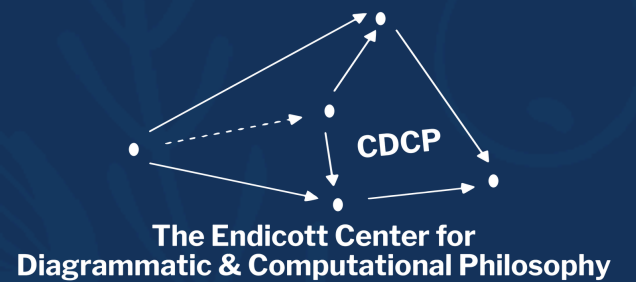
**Fernando Tohmé**, PhD, is a former Fulbright Scholar who has held visiting positions at U.C. Berkeley, Washington University in St. Louis and Endicott College. He holds an undergraduate degree in Mathematics and a Ph.D. in Economics. He is a Principal Researcher of CONICET (National Research Council of Argentina) and a Full Professor at the Department of Economics of the Universidad Nacional del Sur, in Bahía Blanca, Argentina. His research focuses on decision problems, game theory, and optimization in socio-economic settings. He has published in such journals as *Theory and Decision*, *Mathematics of Social Sciences*, *Omega*, *Artificial Intelligence*, *Mathematical and Computational Modeling*, and *Annals of Operations Research*.



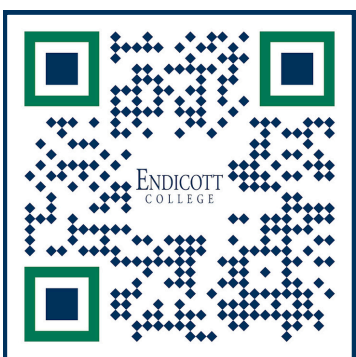
