Visual & Performing Arts

This spring, the School of Visual and Performing Arts at Endicott College invites you and your student to experience a vibrant lineup of exhibitions, performances, and special events throughout April and early May. Whether you are planning a campus visit or encouraging your student to attend, these events offer a wonderful opportunity to engage with the creativity and energy of our community.

Our gallery season continues through mid-April with two compelling exhibitions that are free and open to the public. In the Carol Grillo Gallery, *Sketchbooks with Soul: Process, Play & Practice* by UK-based artist Helen Wells is on view through April 17, offering an intimate look at her joyful, process-driven sketchbooks and creative exploration. In the Heftler Gallery, *Through The Eye of a Needle: Jim Wright Journals* remains on view through April 13, featuring the photographer's reflective journals and images that capture both iconic figures and the quiet beauty of everyday American life.

The galleries will conclude the school year with the Senior Thesis & Capstone exhibitions, a celebration of our graduating students. These exhibitions will feature work from each of our majors, showcasing the talent, dedication, and creativity of our students across the School of Visual and Performing Arts.

April performances begin with Endicott's Mainstage production of *Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street*, presented in the Rose Theater April 8–11 at 7:30 p.m., with additional performances April 11 at 2 p.m. and April 12 at 2 p.m. Tickets are \$20 for general admission, \$15 for seniors and students of other institutions, and free for Endicott students. On Friday, April 10, from 2–5 p.m., the Center for the Arts hosts its annual Art Sale and Open Studios, a free event inviting visitors to explore student work, meet the artists, and support their creative efforts. Jazz lovers can enjoy the 10th Annual Intercollegiate Jazz Festival on Wednesday, April 15, at 6 p.m. in the Rose Theater, featuring the Endicott Jazz Band alongside guest ensembles; tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students.

Later in the month, the Repertory Dance Ensemble presents its Guest Choreography Series XVI on Friday, April 24, at 7:30 p.m. and Sunday, April 26, at 1 p.m. in the Rose Theater. This exciting program features new works by faculty and guest choreographers; tickets are \$15 general admission and \$5 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students. On Tuesday, April 28, at 5:30 p.m., the Modern Band Project presents *Raise the Roof* on the Center for the Arts Green Roof (with the Rose Theater as a rain location), offering an energetic mix of rock, pop, and original music. Tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students.

As the semester draws to a close, performances continue with the Endicott Singers' POPS concert, *Love Songs*, on Thursday, April 30, at 7:30 p.m. and Saturday, May 2, at 2 p.m. in Tia's Theater. Tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students. On Friday, May 1, at 3 p.m., the Senior Capstone and Thesis Exhibition opens across all gallery spaces, celebrating the Class of 2026; this event is free and open to the public.

The first week of May highlights student performance at its finest. The Percussion and

Theater; tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students. On Monday, May 4, the Solo Student Recital takes place in two parts—Act I at 6:30 p.m. and Act II at 7:30 p.m.—with tickets priced at \$15 for general admission and free for Endicott students. The season concludes on Tuesday, May 5, at 5 p.m. with the Performing Arts Capstone Recital in the Rose Theater, where graduating seniors present original and reimagined works; tickets are \$15 general admission and free for Endicott students.

Student Employment

Each summer, Endicott College offers students the opportunity to live and work on campus. Many departments—including Physical Plant, Misselwood Events, Admissions, and the Post Center—hire students from May through August.

If your student is planning on working at Endicott over the summer and has never worked on campus before, federal regulations require them to complete the [I-9 process](#) within three days of their first day of work. This involves having their school ID, along with their original birth certificate, passport, or social security card, copied by the Student Employment Office. Copies of documents must be presented
