Residence Life

Halls close on Friday, May 8, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. Students are expected to move out of their housing assignment 24 hours after their last final, or by the above date, whichever comes first. Students are directed to either sign up for a check-out appointment with their RD or A/RD to confirm all items are removed from the space, keys are collected (if applicable), and damages are noted. Students can also opt into an Express Checkout, which waives the need to meet with a member of Residence Life upon moving out, but these also waive a student's right to appeal any damage charges that may be applied.

Summer Housing begins on May 26 and runs until August 21. Students can apply now in their housing portal until May 15 for summer housing. Students must have an on-campus job, a campus-sponsored internship, an athletic requirement, or participate in on-campus classes in order to qualify for summer housing.

Office of Sustainability

As you're helping your Gull move out of the Nest this month, make sure to visit the **College Cleanse** donation boxes instead of the dumpster! Each May, the Sustainable Endicott and the Community Service offices divert thousands of pounds of gently used clothing and household goods from the landfill, and instead donate these items to our neighbors in need. College Cleanse donation boxes for unopened, nonperishable food, gently used clothing and bedding, books, and housewares are located in the lobbies of all main residence halls. Mattress toppers, expired food, anything wet, moldy, or dirty, and trash should still go in the temporary dumpsters. Students, faculty, and staff are welcome to take any donated items FOR FREE when they [sign up](#) to volunteer!

Visual & Performing Arts

As the semester draws to a close, performances continue with the Endicott Singers' POPS concert, *Love Songs*, on Saturday, May 2, at 2 p.m. in Tia's Theater. Tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students. On Friday, May 1, at 3 p.m., the Senior Capstone and Thesis Exhibition opens across all gallery spaces, celebrating the Class of 2026; this event is free and open to the public.

The first week of May highlights student performance at its finest. The Percussion and Chamber Ensembles will present a joint concert on Sunday, May 3, at 2 p.m. in the Rose Theater; tickets are \$15 general admission and \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, faculty, and staff, with free admission for Endicott students. On Monday, May 4, the Solo Student Recital takes place in two parts—Act I at 6:30 p.m. and Act II at 7:30 p.m.—with tickets priced at \$15 for general admission and free for Endicott students. The season concludes on Tuesday, May 5, at 5 p.m. with the Performing Arts Capstone Recital in the Rose Theater. where graduating

seniors present original and reimagined works; tickets are \$15 general admission and free for Endicott students.

Spring is an ideal time to experience the arts at Endicott, and we hope you and your student will join us in celebrating the remarkable work of our talented community. Tickets available at [Tickets.endicott.edu](https://tickets.endicott.edu)

Beginning on Friday, May 1, at 3:00 p.m., the Senior Capstone & Thesis Exhibition: Class of 2026 opens in the Carol Grillo Gallery, with installations spanning all galleries and a Senior Thesis Award Nominees Presentation in the Rose Theater. Free and open to the public, this culminating exhibition celebrates the exceptional work of graduating seniors across the School of Visual and Performing Arts, highlighting their creativity, innovation, and dedication while inviting the community to recognize their achievements.

On Sunday, May 3, at 2:00 p.m. in the Rose Theater, the Percussion & Chamber Ensemble Concert brings together two dynamic student groups for an engaging afternoon of music. Chamber Ensemble performers showcase their versatility across a wide range of instruments, while the Percussion Ensemble presents original compositions on an array of percussion instruments. Directed by George Darrah and Nathan Cohen, the concert promises a vibrant and memorable musical experience. General admission is \$15, with discounted tickets available for seniors, students, alumni, and faculty/staff at \$10, and free admission for Gull Card students.

The Solo Student Recital takes place on Monday, May 4, in the Rose Theater, with Act I at 6:30 p.m. and Act II at 7:30 p.m. This intimate performance features students studying voice, instruments, and theater through private instruction, presenting a wide range of solo works and monologues. Audiences can expect performances spanning guitar, piano, percussion, musical theater, jazz, classical art song, original compositions, and comedy. Act I highlights first- and second-year students, followed by Act II featuring third- and fourth-year performers. General admission is \$15, and Gull Card students are admitted free.

On Tuesday, May 5, at 5:30 p.m., the Modern Band Project presents “Raise the Roof” on the Green Roof just off the third-floor lobby, with a rain location in the Rose Theater. This high-energy performance features students performing a mix of rock and singer-songwriter repertoire, with selections ranging from the 1970s to today, and even the possibility of original songs. Set against an ocean backdrop, the concert offers a lively and unique outdoor experience. General admission is \$15, with tickets priced at \$10 for seniors, students, alumni, and faculty/staff, and free for Gull Card students.

Looking ahead to the summer season, the VPAC will participate in the Concours d’Elegance, offering a fresh opportunity to experience a new exhibition following last year’s show in the Heftler Gallery. The event will include a brunch reception—an updated take on Cars & Coffee—featuring classic cars, art, and food in a celebratory atmosphere. Additional details will be announced soon.

Student Employment

To meet federal requirements, the Student Employment Office must verify each student employee's identity and authorization to work in the United States. If your student plans to work this fall, they will need to bring original identification documents to the Student Employment Office within three days of their start date. A passport is one simple option. If they do not have a passport, they may instead present one of the following combinations:

- School ID and Social Security card
- School ID and birth certificate

We understand these are important documents. If you prefer, your student is welcome to stop by our office during Orientation or move-in day to have copies made and kept on file should they decide to secure a job. This allows you to take the original documents back home with you.
